# Jürgen Stock

**Jürgen Stock** (born 4 October 1959) is a German police officer and academic. He has served as Secretary General of **Interpol** since 7 November 2014.

## Biography [ edit ]

Stock was born on 4 October 1959 in **Wetzlar**, Germany.<sup>[1]</sup> He joined the **Kriminalpolizei** in **Hesse** in 1978 and stayed on as an officer until 1992. Between 1992 and 1996 he went to the **University of Giessen** to occupy himself with scientific research in criminology. In 1996 he worked as a lawyer, before returning to the **Bundeskriminalamt** to become the deputy head of a unit combating economic crime.<sup>[1]</sup> Stock became President of the University of Applied Police Science located in **Saxony-Anhalt** in 1998.

In 2000 he returned once more to the Bundeskriminalamt to head the Institute of Law Enforcement Studies and Training. In 2004 he became Vice President of the Bundeskriminalamt.<sup>[1]</sup>

He is also an **Honorary Professor** for **Law** and **Criminology** at the **University of Giessen**.<sup>[2]</sup>

## Interpol [ edit ]

Since 2005 Stock has worked for **Interpol**. He was Vice President of Europe at the organisation between 2007 and 2010.<sup>[1]</sup> On 7 November 2014 he was elected Secretary General of Interpol by the General Assembly, he took over the position from **Ronald Noble** with immediate effect.<sup>[3]</sup> He was elected for a five-year term.<sup>[4]</sup>
